You will then be unlocked from Procare once these forms have been updated. These forms are required to be updated yearly per State Licensing. Below are the dates you will be locked out of Procare based on your child's age group:

Thursday, September 10th: Infant A & B Monday, September 14th: EPS A Wednesday, September 16th: Preschool A Friday, September 18th: Pre-K A Friday, September 11th: Toddler Tuesday, September 15th: EPS B Thursday, September 17th: Preschool B Monday, September 21st: Pre-K B

Nurse Terry's Tips:

ice Aren't So Nice

WHAT ARE LICE?

ice are very, very small insects (parasites), in fact, you can barely see them! They are brown and gray and only about the size of a sesame seed. They live off other living things. Head lice need to be next to skin to survive. Lice eat tiny amounts of blood for their nourishment and use their sticky little feet to hold on to hair. I agree, GROSS!

When lice start living in hair, they also start to lay eggs (nits). They can survive up to 30 days on a person's head and can lay eight eggs a day. Lice attach their nits to pieces of hair, close to the scalp. If you see a small, oval blob on a strand of hair, and is very difficult to remove with fingers, that's probably a nit. If these little eggs are yellow, tan, or brown, the lice haven't hatched yet. If the eggs are white or clear or '4" away from scalp, the lice have hatched. Although they don't hurt, lice sometimes can irritate the skin and make it itchy (especially at night). Too much scratching can lead to scalp infections.

LICE LOVE EVERYONE

Because Lice are parasites, they will set up house on anyone's head, whether that person is clean, dirty, in second grade, black, white, or purple. Anyone who says that people who get lice are dirty doesn't know that lice love everyone and that includes the cleanest kid in the class! Lice spread in classrooms and schools because kids play together closely and often share more things than adults do.

LICE CANNOT JUMP OR FLY. They spread when people's heads touch or when they share hats and other clothing, combs, brushes, headbands, barrettes, stuffed animals and bedding. If lice are stuck on any of these things and that thing touches another person's head, that person may also get lice.

SAYING GOODBYE TO LICE.

If you think you or your kid has lice, report it to your physician and school nurse. Don't wait around – the more time the lice have to lay nits, the itchier you will be!

Updated Medical Forms & Shot Records

Hello Bright Star Parents!

THANK YOU to the many parents who have been diligent and have up to date shot records for their children here at Bright Star! Another huge THANK YOU to those who have notified us of appointments for their children's Wellness Exam.

Anytime you need a Child's Medical Statement form to take to an appointment, please stop by the Nurse's Office or request one to be emailed to you.

This is a good time to discuss with everyone else the importance of bringing your child's Immunization and Wellness Exam records to the Office, especially if you have received a notice via email. It is

imperative that Bright Star maintains a complete and accur<mark>ate file for each child.</mark>

The Wellness Exam is to be done once a year until your child is 18 years old.

Immunizations may be due at the time of the Wellness Exam or at in between intervals depending on the schedule for each shot.

have note, it is a state requirement and audits are done regularly on our facility to each child. All required records are done that updated records are due by August 24th unless you have communicated that an appointment is in the near future.
